CSUF Police Department Pursues Prestigious National Accreditation

Fullerton, CA (April 15, 2026) – The CSUF Police Department will host a team of assessors from the [International Association of Campus Law Enforcement Administrators \(IACLEA\)](#) this month, as part of the agency's pursuit of national accreditation.

The assessment will include a comprehensive review of the CSUF Police Department's policies and procedures, management, operations, and support services to ensure compliance with IACLEA's nationally recognized standards for campus law enforcement agencies.

Following the review, the assessors will submit their findings to the IACLEA executive board, which will determine the department's accreditation status. Accreditation is awarded for a four-year period, during which agencies must submit annual reports demonstrating continued compliance.

IACLEA On-Site Assessment

The department’s Accreditation Coordinator, Jeniffer Vallejo Rollins, has led the extensive preparation efforts for the on-site review.

The assessment team, comprised of experienced law enforcement professionals from across the country, will evaluate written materials, conduct interviews, and inspect facilities to verify compliance with IACLEA standards.

The assessment team includes:

- Matthew Dillon, retired CSU Chico Police Chief and IACLEA assessment team leader, who brings more than 27 years of experience in university policing. Dillon serves as co-chair of the “Presidential Task Force to Examine University Police Policies and Practices.”
- Tiffany Castle, has over 30 years of law enforcement experience and previously served as accreditation manager at the University of Florida Police Department for their IACLEA, CALEA, and state accreditation.
